WHO WE ARE

The March of Dimes has been protecting the health of children and babies for nearly 70 years. Our victory over polio in the 1950s proved the enormous power of the partnership between scientists and volunteers on which the March of Dimes was built. Today, these same forces continue to fight threats to our babies' health and future. And with ongoing help from people like you, and the small businesses and large corporations that contribute to our lifesaving work, future parents will be able to experience the joy of having healthy babies.

WHAT WE DO

The March of Dimes funds the best and brightest researchers throughout the country and abroad to unravel the mysteries behind premature birth and birth defects. We offer educational programs to help women have healthy pregnancies and healthy, full-term babies. And we educate health professionals to address risk factors pregnant women might have that could lead to complications. We also speak out as advocates for federal and state policies and for initiatives that address maternal and infant health issues.

The March of Dimes works directly with families of critically ill infants through the NICU Family Support Project. This unique program provides information and comfort to families with babies in the Doernbecher Neonatal Care Center at Oregon Health & Science University.

Each year the March of Dimes awards grants to community programs that promote maternal and infant health with an emphasis on reducing birth defects and infant mortality. In 2007, the March of Dimes is investing \$116,000 in grants to eight local organizations.

The March of Dimes is also committed to supporting research programs that benefit everyone. Several local researchers studying the causes, effects, and possible treatments for birth defects receive March of Dimes grants. Nearly \$1 million is currently committed to researchers at Oregon Health & Science University, Oregon State University, and the University of Oregon.

WHY WE DO IT

The hope of every pregnant woman is to have a healthy baby. And that's also the hope of the March of Dimes. To reach this goal, the foundation concentrates on saving babies from being born early or sick, and on treating those who come into the world with problems.

Our Ambassadors, the Buchanans of Oregon City, are poignant reminders of the medical advances and innovative programs funded by the March of Dimes. All three of Grant and Kim Buchanan's daughters were born prematurely and suffered from health complications.

Pregnant with twins, Kim knew she was at a greater risk for delivering early. But she was not prepared when, at a routine prenatal appointment, her doctor told her she was in labor.

Riley and Jenna were born soon after at just 30 weeks gestation. Both girls weighed less than three pounds and suffered from serious complications. They spent two months in the neonatal intensive care unit.

Now six years old, Jenna and Riley are healthy and active kindergartners who enjoy playing soccer and riding their bikes.

Five years after the birth of the twins, Grant and Kim were expecting their third daughter. As a result of Kim's prenatal care, her doctor discovered a rare defect in the baby's intestine, causing it to be severely twisted and blocked. Ainsley was born five weeks premature and weighed less than five pounds. She underwent surgery shortly after birth to repair her intestine. After three weeks in the neonatal intensive care unit, Ainsley came home.

Now one-year-old, Ainsley recently had a second surgery on her intestine. She is recovering well and chasing after her big sisters.

"The girls are incredibly lucky to have been born in a time with medical research and advancements funded by the March of Dimes, such as surfactant therapy and NICU technology," said Kim. "The March of Dimes helped save their lives."

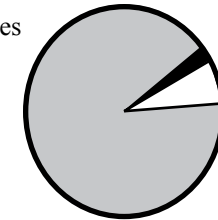
